



There are no seam allowances on these patterns.

I used a tea towel for the back of the bib.

1. The 1 inch (2.5cm) square is for you to measure to be sure the pattern has printed accurately. You need to choose 100% when printing, not fit to page.
2. Make the pleat first. Machine 1 inch from the folded edge and press the pleat open.
3. Put the 2 bib pieces right sides together, machine all the way round except for a small opening. The opening is best on a straight edge.
4. Snip from the edge to close to the stitching round the curves. Turn out to the RS through the small hole. Press. Machine close to the edge all round.
5. Stitch velcro or make a buttonhole or add a popper to the curved bit that will fasten behind the neck.

To make the bow tie.

1. Both pieces are made the same way.
2. Put RS together and machine all the way round. As these are really small leaving a gap in the machining is difficult.
3. With a small sharp pair of scissors cut a slit in the back layer of fabric. Turn out through the slit.
4. Push out the corners and press.
5. Put the big part of the bow where you want it on the bib and machine all round the edge.
6. Put the small square in place and machine round the edge.

I added buttons to mine, but make sure they are very firmly attached so a child can't swallow them.
